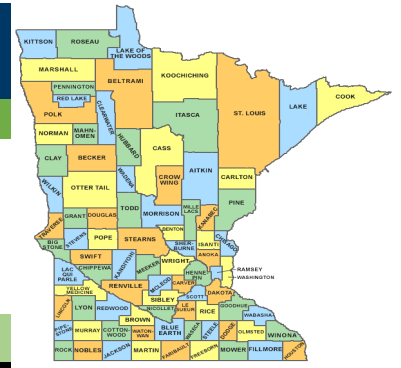


COUNTY PROFILE

Anoka Co.

Anoka Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 11, which is located in the Twin Cities Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

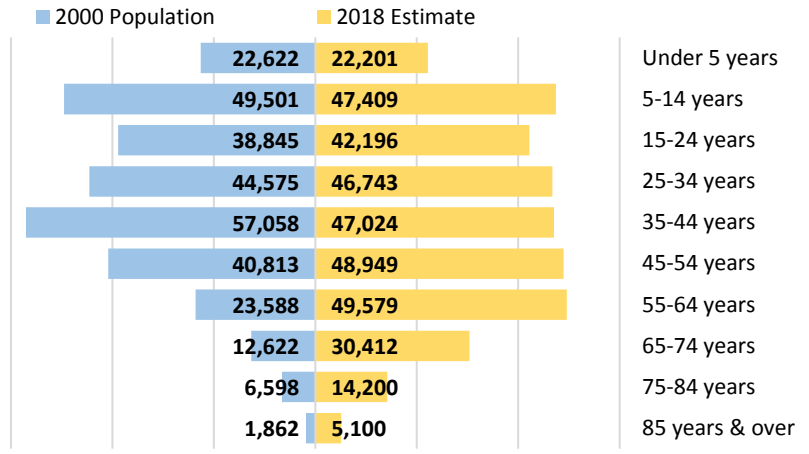
Anoka Co.'s population has increased so far this decade, ranking as the 10th fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2018. It is now the 4th largest in the state. Anoka Co.'s population has an older median age than the state and a smaller percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Anoka Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2010 to 2018, but also experienced net in-migration - meaning more people moved in than moved out. In addition to domestic in-migration, Anoka Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

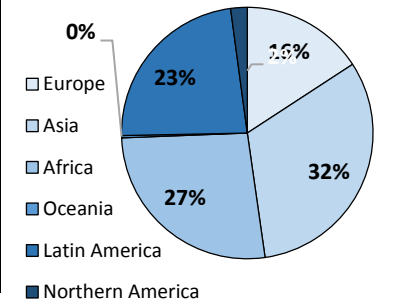

Compared to the state, Anoka Co. has a smaller percentage of foreign-born residents. From 2010 to 2017, Anoka Co. saw an increase in the number of foreign-born residents, though that was slower than the 22.2% statewide increase.

Figure 3. Population by Race, 2017

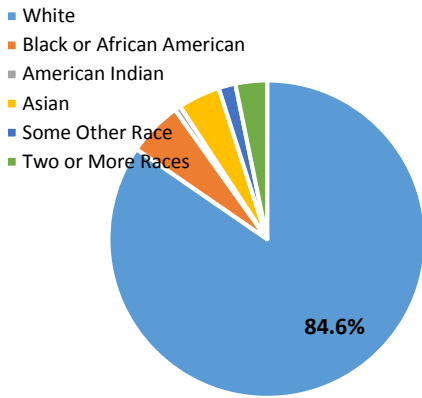

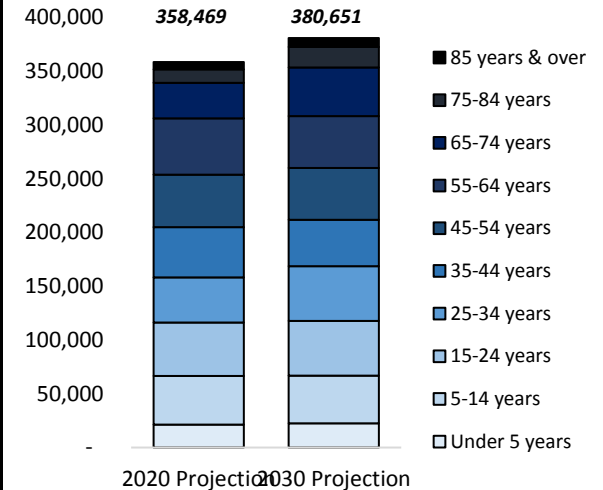
POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Anoka Co.'s population is expected to grow from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is faster than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). In addition to the overall growth, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Anoka Co. has a higher percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.2%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Anoka Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

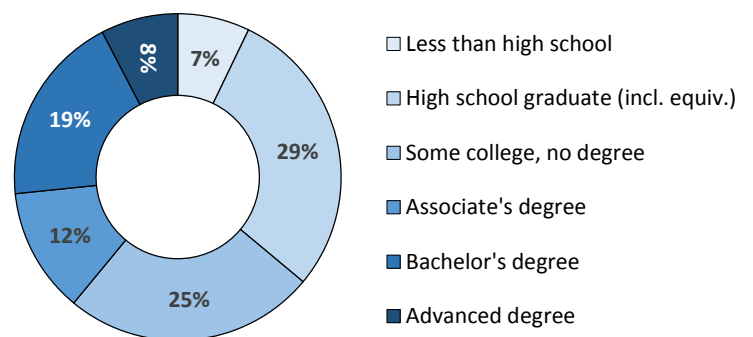

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2017



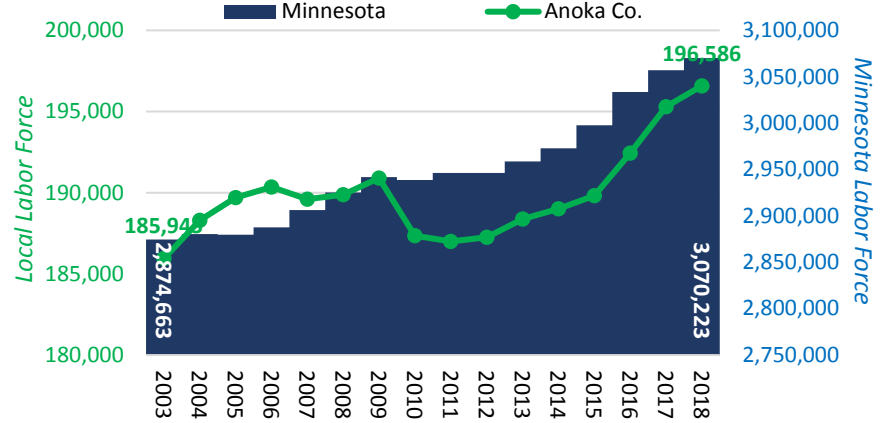

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

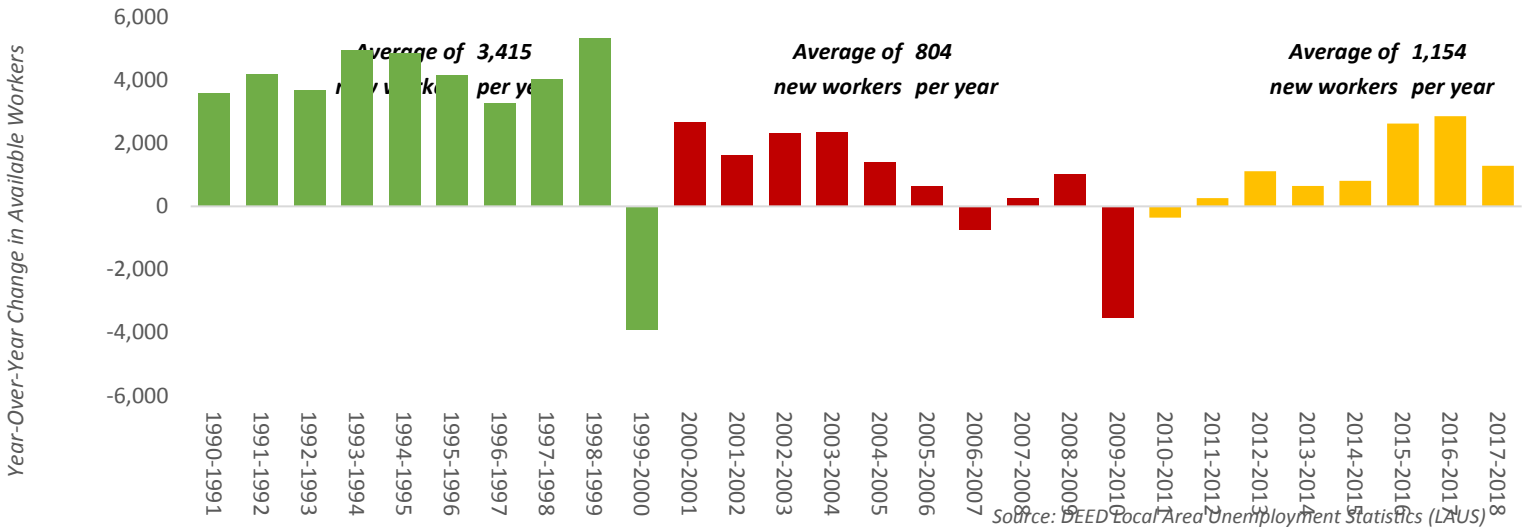
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Anoka Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Anoka Co.'s labor force expanded more slowly from 2003 to 2018, compared to a statewide growth rate of 7.8% (see Figure 6).

At 2.8%, Anoka Co. had a lower unemployment rate than the state (2.9%) in 2018. Anoka Co.'s unemployment rate declined compared to 3.3% in 2017, and was lower than the 8.4% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Anoka Co. declined over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.

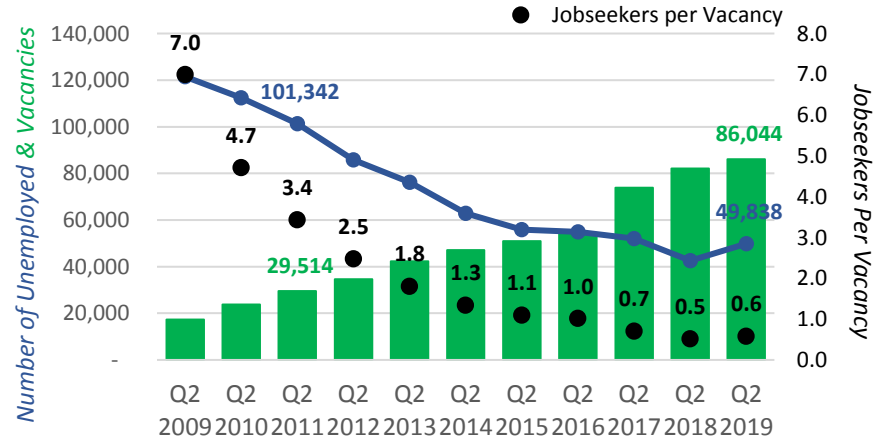
Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Anoka Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a gain of new workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Anoka Co. is expected to add workers from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Anoka Co. is a part of Region 11, which includes Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 0.6 jobseekers per vacancy during the 4th quarter of 2018 (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Anoka Co. had a higher labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Anoka Co. is less racially diverse than the state (85.9% or workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

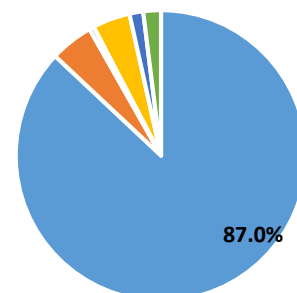

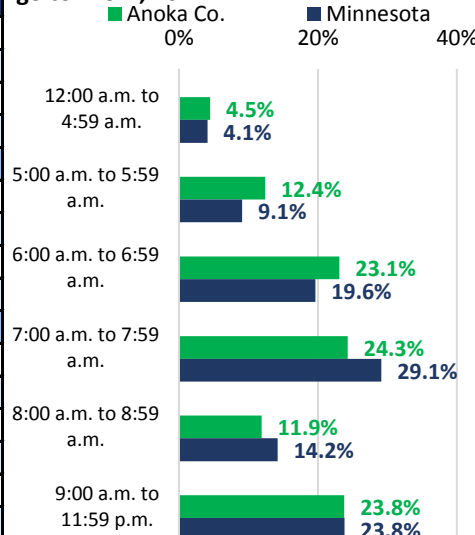

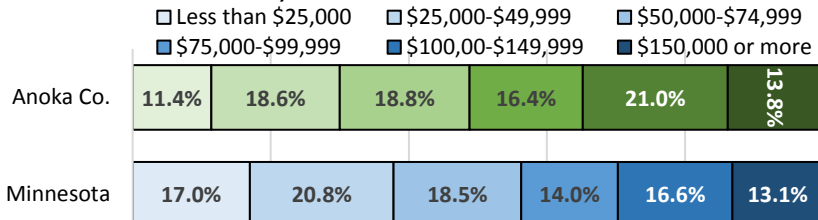
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Anoka Co. also had a higher cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$16 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$19.42 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

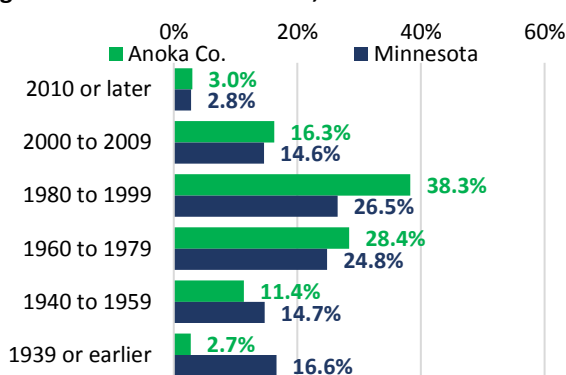

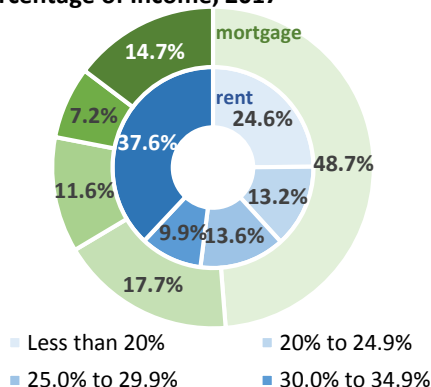

OCCUPATIONS

At \$22.78 in 2019, wages were higher in Region 11 than the state. Overall, Region 11 had the highest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$56.09) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$12.1) (see Table 11).

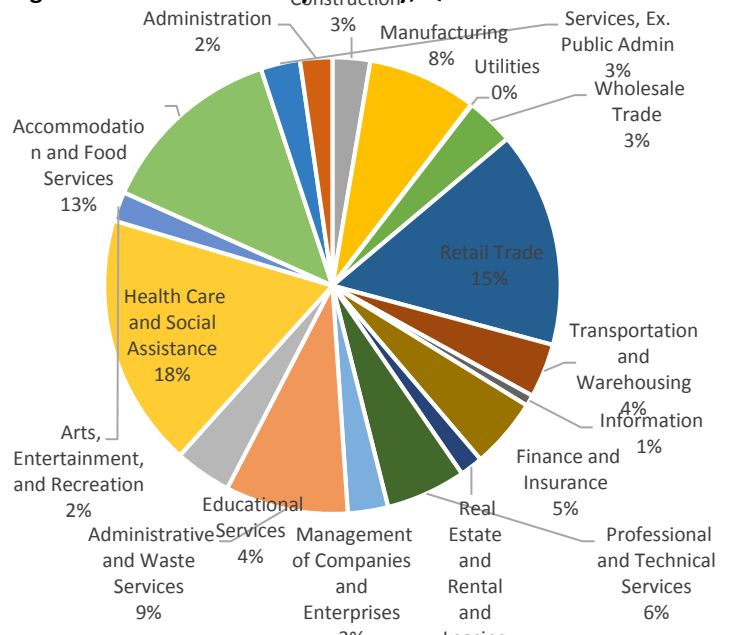
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Anoka Co. is a part of Region 11, which includes Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, and Washington County. There were 86044 job vacancies posted by employers in the 2nd Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).

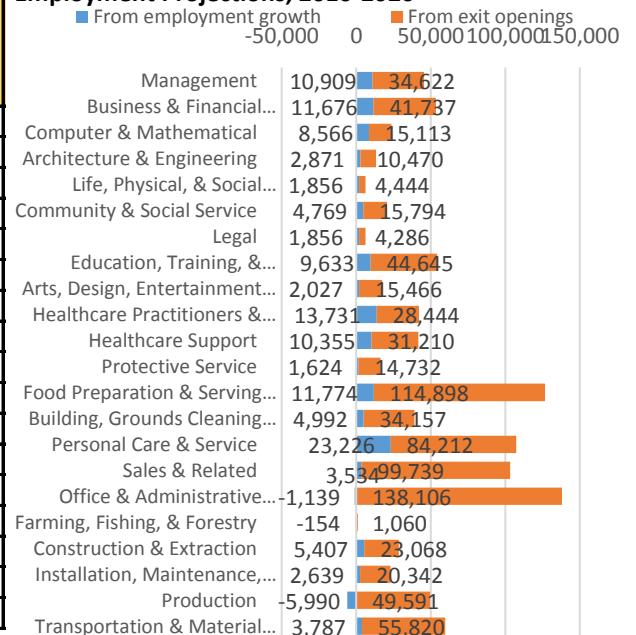

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After gaining jobs over the past year, Anoka Co. had the 4th largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Anoka Co. was the 8th fastest growing in the past year and the 11th fastest growing since 2013. From 2013 to 2018, employers in Anoka Co. added jobs, outpacing the state's 7.0% growth rate.

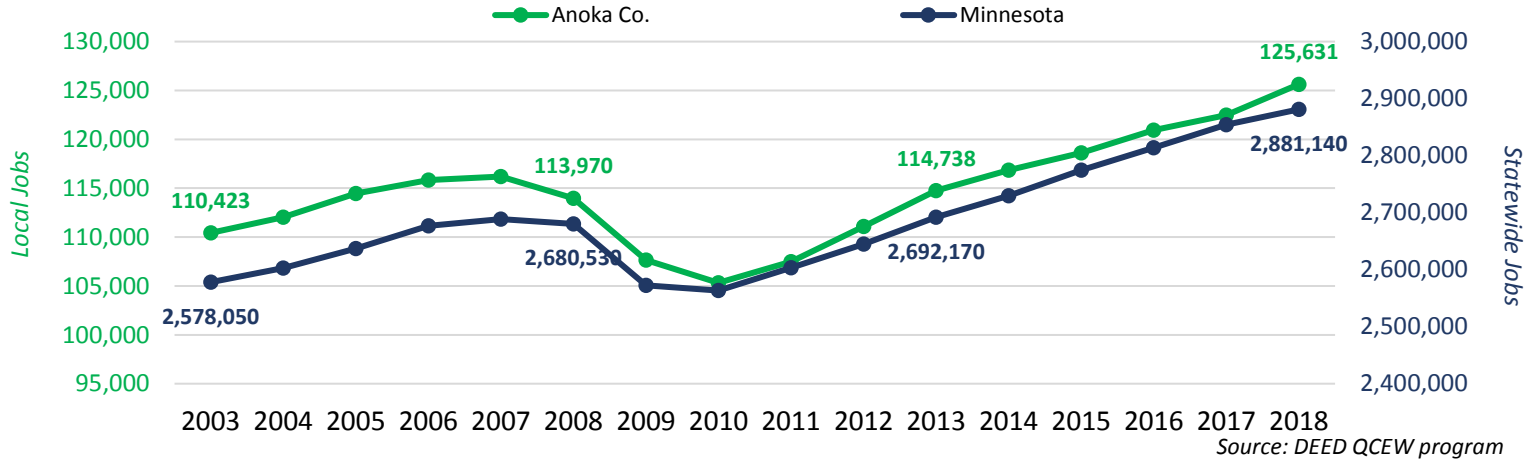

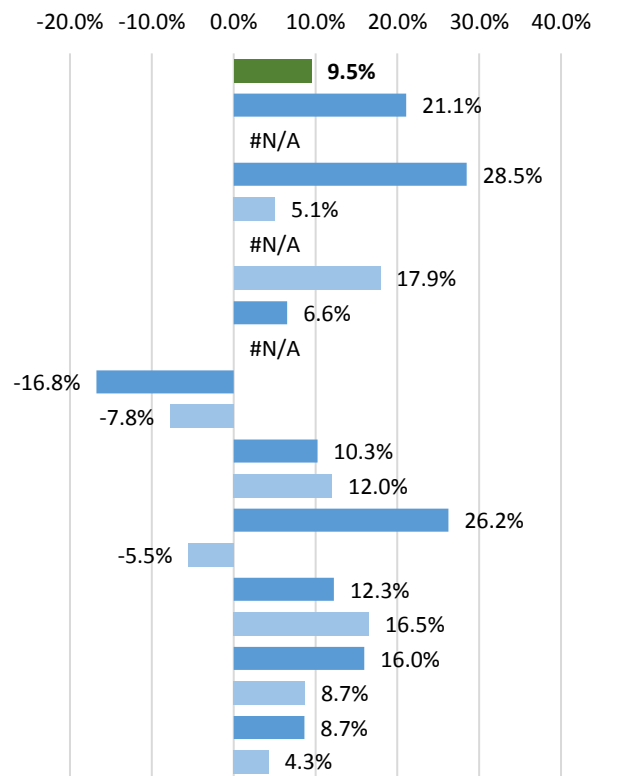
